



Message from the Chair



Welcome to the 2024 Jewish Heritage Festival. After our much-needed post-COVID 2022 Festival, we did not think that circumstances would make the 2024 Festival as urgently needed. However, "in this ever-changing world in which we live in",\* this year's Festival seems even more urgent for the Jewish Community and supporters of Israel. The post-October 7th world has not only put the Jewish people's homeland in

jeopardy, but has also allowed festering antisemitism to flourish, becoming more pervasive in the United States and the world. Thankfully, our Jewish community has great support from Sheriff Chitwood, our other elected officials and the greater Volusia/Flagler community in combatting any potential local effects.

The Festival started as the vision of the Temple Presidents' Council for Volusia and Flagler Counties. A Steering Committee began meeting in January, 2007 leading to our first event in March, 2008, which was a rousing success that attracted 10,000 visitors. As one of our food vendors told the Daytona Beach News-Journal: "This is better than Bike Week". Even with the COVID pause, we are now presenting our heritage for the 8th time!

The Festival is a 501(c)(3) non-profit corporation with the sole purpose to put this Festival on every other year. Festival funding has come from Sponsorships and tax-deductible Family/Individual Donations. We are proud once again to have the Endowment Fund of the Jewish Federation of Volusia and Flagler Counties as our Grand Sponsor as well as great local support from corporate and individual sponsorship.

Radiology Associates Imaging is again the presenting sponsor of the Health Fair, and we thank them for that! We are excited by the response of our medical community as they share the Jewish spirit of *Tikkun Olam* - to repair the world.

The Festival features continuous nationally acclaimed entertainment. Attendees can feast on Kosher, Deli-style and Mediterranean food. We have arts, crafts, packaged foods and Judaica vendors, Jewish Organization booths, speakers and exhibits including a Holocaust Memorial. Children's entertainment is available throughout the day including a Matzah making interactive demonstration, inflatables, face painting, a balloon artist, a petting zoo and our signature camel rides. You will even run into Moses and other biblical characters!

The Festival expresses the heart and soul of Jewish Florida. For a single day, it intertwines the sounds, sights, and spirit of Jewish culture and weaves together every facet of the Jewish Community, young and old, singles and families, regardless of their religious and cultural background. Like other cultural festivals, we also want to share our heritage with others - you don't have to be Jewish to enjoy a Jewish Festival! Let's celebrate Jewish Heritage.



# In Memoriam Claire Soria

MAY 22, 1935 - SEPTEMBER 12, 2023

We have been honored to have Claire Soria as a spokesperson who shared her experiences as a Holocaust survivor with us at the last three Jewish Heritage Festivals.

Claire considered herself one of the lucky ones. Claire Soria would light up the room with her presence. Our speaker room would be standing room only. As she told her story you couldn't hear a pin drop.

Once after a speech, a 7 year old girl asked her, "Why do you not hate, especially after all the hatred you have seen in your life?" She looked deeply into this young girl's eyes and said "If you hate, they win." She loved to share her story and showcase her unshakable, positive attitude with hope and confidence in the good of people everywhere.



Claire Soria (born May 22, 1935) was a young child living in Brussels, Belgium when the Nazis sent tanks down her street and replaced the Belgian flags with the Nazi flags.

Once the Nazis took over, Jewish children like Claire were banned from attending school. All Jews were forced to wear a yellow star of David and were restricted from doing ordinary activities such as

meeting with each other, worshiping the Jewish religion, and shopping after dark.

Claire's father Nathan/Nachman Mytnowiecki was a tailor who was secretly involved with the underground resistance. Claire's mother Sara asked a neighbor, a Christian couple, Lea and Lambert Sabaux, if they would hide Claire and they agreed. Nathan and Sara were arrested and deported to Auschwitz where they ultimately perished.



This elderly righteous gentile couple risked their lives hiding Claire, raising her as their own granddaughter. The Sabauxes were musicians – Lea, a former concert pianist, and Lambert, a drummer – who instilled in Claire a lifelong love for playing piano.




After the war, Claire was sent to the US near Cleveland to live with her aunt and uncle at the age of thirteen. She struggled to adapt and bounced around during her teenage years, not

speaking any English but eventually found the love of her life, Gerard Soria, and had three children. She also took that learned passion and became a

beloved community piano teacher. Claire is survived by her children - Robert, Rita and Maxine - as well her eight grandchildren and seven great-grandchildren.

Claire Soria passed away on September 12, 2023, surrounded by the family she persevered to create. We will never forget her.

# In Memoriam Jerry & Esther Krueger

Two of our original Board of Directors, Jerry and Esther Krueger, passed on in 2023. Both were enthusiastic, tireless workers who especially loved to spread the word of the Festival by passing out

flyers and posters all along the beachside as each Festival approached.

Jerry and Esther were married 75 years, and, like most inseparable couples, passed within months of each other in 2023. They moved to Daytona Beach to live closer to family in the area. These two stayed active from when they met in 1946, with a life full of extraordinary careers behind them and a busy schedule in Daytona working with WISE (Wisdom In Senior Education) at Daytona State College as well as our Festival. Jerry was also treasurer of Temple Israel.

Jerry was a WW2 veteran who served in the Army Air Corps as a flight radio operator. When the war ended in 1945, he had just two years of college under his belt. Through the GI Bill, he was able to attend Rutgers University Law School on an accelerated program that allowed him to obtain his law degree in two years. During this time, his aunt met the mother of his future wife Esther, who provided her number to him. Esther was a Cadet nurse who had trained to be a registered nurse during the war. A week later, Jerry's brother had tickets to a Dinah Shore show in New York City but required Jerry to bring a date. He decided to call Esther to see if she would join him. She said she would only go if he met her in person, so he went to the hospital where she was working in New Jersey. They walked

around the grounds during her break that day. That day marked the beginning of their over seven-decade relationship. The two were married in 1947 and had their first of three children in 1948.

Jerry practiced law for many years. Esther went back to school to get her BA degree and taught at Jersey City State college. She received her master's at Montclair State College and doctorate at Columbia University. She taught at Kean University in New Jersey, retiring



in 1965. While working at his private practice, Jerry was asked to run for councilman of Linden, NJ; he won the position and served for two years. He was then elected as President of the City Council and later was elected to the State of New Jersey legislature for a year. With this experience, he became the city attorney for the city of Linden for almost 30 years while still maintaining his private practice. Jerry retired at the age of 91.

The key to a healthy and happy life and marriage, Jerry would say, "is to have love, mutual respect, encourage each other in whatever they want to do, meet new people, enjoy your relatives and friends, engage in meaningful activities and stay involved with your community."

Jerry and Esther will be missed.

He ran many planning and brainstorming sessions and produced many wonderful projects and programs for our congregation The Men's Club was instrumental in helping at the Hard Rock Hanukkah party. Another first was "The Worldwide Wrap," a workshop where all could learn how to put on Tefillin. Again, we participated in the Yom HaShoah candle project to remember those who perished in the Holocaust.



# Life in the SHTETL

### A Presentation by Award Winning Photojournalist Karen Sandvick

The history of the oldest Eastern European shtetls began about a millennium ago and saw long periods of relative tolerance and prosperity as well as times of extreme poverty and hardship.

Not only did the Jews of the shtetl speak a unique language (Yiddish), but they also had a unique rhetorical style, rooted in traditions of Talmudic learning.



# THE HOLOCAUST EXHIBIT

The United States Holocaust Museum states that The Holocaust was the systematic, bureaucratic, state sponsored persecution and murder



of approximately six million Jews by the Nazi regime and its collaborators. During the era of the Holocaust, the Nazis, who came to power in Germany in January 1922, also targeted other groups because of their perceived "racial inferiority" such as Gypsies, the disabled, and Slavic peoples (Poles, Russians). Other groups were

persecuted on political, ideological and behavioral grounds such as the communists, socialists, Jehovah's witnesses and homosexuals.

Between 1941 and 1944, Nazi German authorities deported millions of Jews from Germany, from occupied territories, and from the countries of many of its Axis allies to ghettos and to killing centers, often called extermination camps, where they were murdered in specially developed gassing facilities.



The Holocaust is a grim reminder of the senseless systematic murder of millions of innocent people and of all humanity lost.

"Henriette's Letters" - "Our Story" 12 photos and explanatory panels from the Holocaust Resource and Education Center in Maitland which tell the stories of 11 women who survived the Holocaust and then



settled in central Florida. One of the survivors of Auzchwitz was Tess Weiss who founded and directed the very first Holocaust Museum in the United States, the Holocaust Resource and Education Center in Matiland. She passed in 2023.





### Presentation by Stephen Poynor

USC Shoah **Foundation's Dimensions in Testimony<sup>SM</sup>** enables people to ask questions that prompt real-time responses from pre-recorded video interviews with Holocaust survivors and other witnesses to genocide. The pioneering project integrates advanced filming techniques, specialized display technologies and next generation natural language processing to create an interactive biography. Now and far into the future, museum-goers, students and others can have conversational interactions with these eyewitnesses to history to learn from those who were there.

The program consists of a Holocaust survivor Pinchas Gutter on a laptop not a hologram... and people can ask questions and the Holocaust survivor on the laptop responds. The Holocaust survivor's answers were prerecorded.

Stephen Poynor serves as the Director of Education at the Holocaust Memorial Resource and Education Center of Florida. In his role, he plays a vital part in helping Florida school districts effectively implement the Florida mandate for Holocaust Education through collaborative educator training, direct student instruction, and curriculum design.

Notably, he also contributed his expertise to the Commissioner of Education's Task Force on Holocaust Education, in the development of the new State of Florida standards for Holocaust Education.

home. The family agreed. The only place they had in their home safe from view of the outside was a chicken coop in the back of the house, where they would remain hidden for nearly a year.

### 3:15 p.m. Ken Tubertini "The Jewish Resistance" Jewish Resistance, the real heroes of the Holocaust.


Ken Tubertini is a Holocaust historian. He taught the Holocaust
